



Mary Teresa Bojaxhiu, better known as **Mother Teresa** or Saint Mother Teresa, was an Albanian-Indian Catholic nun, founder of the Missionaries of Charity and is a Catholic saint. Born in Skopje, then part of the Ottoman Empire, she was raised in a devoutly Catholic family.

Mary was a first-century Jewish woman of Nazareth, the wife of Joseph and the **mother of Jesus**. She is an important figure of Christianity, venerated under various titles such as virgin or queen, many of them mentioned in the Litany of Loreto.



Diana, Princess of Wales, was a member of the British royal family. She was the first wife of Charles III and mother of Princes William and Harry. Her activism and glamour, which made her an international icon, earned her enduring popularity.



Maria Salomea Skłodowska-Curie, known simply as **Marie Curie**, was a Polish and naturalised-French physicist and chemist who conducted pioneering research on radioactivity.

She won 2 nobel prizes for physics while raising her 2 daughters on her own.
